We adhere to the Jesuit educational philosophy of the **Graduate at Graduation**, which means we're committed to educating young men who, by the time they graduate from our school, are:

Open to Growth

The student accepts responsibility for his own growth, seeks opportunities to stretch his mind, and is learning how to accept himself, his talents and his limitations.

Intellectually Competent

The student has achieved a level of competence in academic skills and subjects required to get him into high school courses, which will in turn prepare him for college.

Religiou

He is respectful of differing religious practices and beliefs, is acquainted with the Gospels – and with Jesus Christ and His redeeming mission. And he's beginning to understand the relationship between faith in Jesus and helping others.

Loving

The student is beginning to move beyond self-interest or self-centeredness. He knows that God's love for him is unconditional, and he's learning that his contributions to the school community enhance the unity of all.

Committed to Doing Justice

He has acquired some of the skills and motivation necessary to live as a man for others. He's developing a sense of compassion – and he's learning that all people have rights and should be treated with respect and dignity.




Our Curriculum

Advancing hearts and minds

Through a balanced combination of Reading, Math, Language Arts, Science, Religion, Social Studies, Fine Arts, Technology, and more, we strive to equip every student with the knowledge and understanding they'll need as they move on to high school and college.

Jesuit Academy students participate in a mandatory extended school day and extended school year. Our school day begins at 7:50 a.m. and ends at 4:30 p.m., with the last hour reserved as time for students to finish class work and work with tutors, if needed. We also require students to attend a mandatory summer session.





- 4th and 5th graders use a combination of readers and novel studies to develop reading strategies and vocabulary enrichment.
- 6th, 7th and 8th graders focus on novel studies, vocabulary enrichment and analysis. Students use a variety of computer-aided resources for specialized instruction.
- Through our school-wide Accelerated Reader program, students use leveled book and comprehension tests. They set goals and focus on books at their tested reading level.

- Jesuit offers a tracked math curriculum, consisting of six levels, to accommodate grade level and advanced learners.
- Our math program culminates with pre-algebra for grade level students in 8th grade and algebra for advanced students.

Language Arts

- Each grade puts a specific emphasis on writing skills and strategies using the six traits of writing.
- Students also work on grammar, spelling and punctuation skills at each grade level.

🛕 Science

- 4th and 5th graders follow the general science curriculum (earth, life, physical)
- 6th, 7th and 8th graders follow a lab-based curriculum that emphasizes the scientific process
- 6th grade: Earth science curriculum
- 7th grade: Life science curriculum
- 8th grade: Physical science curriculum

+ Religion

- Our theology curriculum is based on Christian precepts and the life of Jesus, and it includes weekly prayer services that all students attend.
- 4th graders focus on Jesus' life and the Ten Commandments.
- 5th and 6th graders focus on the Old Testament.
- 7th graders study the New Testament.
- 8th graders focus on world religions and one's personal relationship with God.
- Our curriculum also includes units on human growth and development and sexuality.

- 5th grade: U.S. History
- 6th grade: World History
- 7th grade: Geography
- 8th grade: African American History


Scholarships and financial assistance

The program fee our students pay is supplemented by sponsorships from our **Education Club**, in which an individual or a group donates tuition money for a specific student. We ask sponsors for a five-year pledge to ensure each student is supported from 4th through 8th grade.

No student is ever turned away from Jesuit Academy because of an inability to pay our program fee, and we will work with families on an individual basis to review options, including the Family Tuition Scholarship.

Jesuit Academy also offers financial assistance to students who graduate from our school and choose to attend a private high school in the Omaha metro area. Students are encouraged to apply for multiple sources of aid, allowing our financial contribution to round out a total package of resources.
